Then returned to preach for another hour. I could have continued but more and more were falling asleep having got up early and not at all used to long messages however powerful. Pastor John Babu writes regarding the ministry at Hyderabad and Nadadavole in East and West Godavi, On the 25th Oct 2004 brother Tony Daly came to Hyderabad. We all gave our brother a hearty welcome. Firstly we went to a slum area called Ambedkar Nagar where Sister P. Devaki has been doing the Lord's ministry. Our brother Tony gave a spirit filled message there and all were filled with the Holy Spirit and much blessed. After the preaching 75 Kgs of rice distributed to the poor and needy. They all expressed their hearty thanks for the free rice distributed.

On the same day evening we went to a slum area to a narrow street. There Pastor Moses is ministering among slum area people. There our team of Pastors prayed, bible women sang songs and prayed. Then our brother gave another message and prayed for a young man who had been suffering since two days without a voice from his mouth. Then he immediately healed and talked clearly. The name of that young man is Mr Screenu. He expressed his hearty thanks to God. He praised the Lord

So also two women who were possessed of evil forces, they both were healed after continuous prayers. They were delivered from evil forces. They gave their testimony. 75 kgs of rice were freely distributed for them.

On 26th October 2004 we went to another slum area rocky place called Ram Nagar there our team pastors and Bible women sang and another spirit filled message given by our brother. They all moved and thanked the Lord.

On the 3rd November Brother Tony came to Nadadavole from Bapatla.

On the same day evening we went to the village church at Katakoesswarm for gospel preaching. On 4th November nearly 60 pastors attended the pastor's conference. Two prayer meetings with teaching from the Bible were given by Brother Tony. We have received good response from both from attended pastors and bible women and others from outside the area. We were all much blessed in these two meetings.

On the 5th November we went to the rice fields for chicken Buffalo for milk project for self supporting income for the pastors fund. On Sunday 7th we went to Thimmarajupalem village to preach among the leper brothers and sisters. A heart opened and eye opening thrilling message given to the lepers by the leading of the |Holy Spirit with Pastors John and Joseph Babu translating into Telugu.

On Sunday 7th by 1. 00 noon time we went to the sub jail, superintendent gave permission at Kovvor a small Taluk headquarter. There were twelve prisoners in the jail the team pastors sang a song and brother Tony gave a thrilling message from the Bible. Out of twelve prisoners 9 were confessed, repented and raised their hands as they accepted \Jesus Christ as their Saviour. Bananas were distributed to the prisoners and to the police staff They all expressed their hearty thanks.

On the 7th evening a good gathering at Rajahmundry quarries, pastor Joseph had arranged, (These were the rock breakers, mostly women) brother Tony gave a spirit filled message. On 8th of November the team and brother Tony visited and prayed among the slum area people.

Some were healed through continuous prayers. We are all praying for all our brothers and sister in the UK. Pastor John Babu. Nadadavole

Report received from Pastor Jidigu in Bapatla. Dearly beloved brother Tony and Sister Sheila Daly. God has used you mightily in India. Even today people share their witnesses in the church.

Outreach Ministry. There has been a great changes in villages and slum areas after you preached there. Some of them accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Saviour. Some got healed. We were surprised and very happy about this.

Prison Ministry All the prisoners are moved by the Gospel of Jesus in you visit to the prisons. They get realised about their sins, murders, robberies and they cried unto God. There is a great change in them. They repented their

guilty. On looking unto them even the police got surprised. Some of the police are attracted to the Gospel Praise the Lord.

Pastors Conference. When you preached with Spirit all the pastors get the power of the Holy Spirit and strength. The word of God strengthened them and made them to be steadfast in their faith. They informed us they came to know many hidden things from the Scriptures and some said they had never heard such powerful messages. They are waiting for your visit again. By looking unto then I than God.

Distribution of Goats to all the families of the Pastors .. Even though you are in difficulties (it was a mud bath after heavy rain the roads were awash, Tony) you have distributed goats among the Pastors as per God's leading. All the pastors say that somehow they relieved from their financial problems. They conveyed their gratefulness to all the members who have helped them. They thank and praise God for this. (12 goats were purchased)

Report on the Orphan children. You made all the children happy by your sings, stories and the Word of God. They always sing the same songs, remember the stories and word of God again and again and make them very happy..

You explained about Hagar's son we were moved to hear such a powerful message. Even the orphaned children are moved to hear that message and wept. We are blessed and comforted to hear your messages.

We thank God for all these things during your visit to India

My report. The land in Bapatla

I was greatly blessed to visit the land purchased for the new orphanage. All the children and many co pastors gathered as we prayed and dedicated the land it to the Lord. They had erected a foundation stone with the inscription "Glory to God with the text Nehemiah 2 v 18. Let us rise up and build....The land is in a good situation and will be developed with new roads and new housing and the children are already playing there after school. All are excited at the prospect of their new home. I purchased a bicycle as there was a long walk for Ashok attending college at night. The bike will be used by the different children as they get older.

Jacob

There was such a change in this man, a prisoner after responding to the Word and prayer in January this year. He returned to his village where everyone was amazed at his changed behaviour. The family requested the Pastor to conduct Bible studies in the village. Jacob is a stone mason, he is illiterate. I heard that he is now happy and attending a Pentecostal church regularly on the Lord's day.

Visaghapatnamn

The Lord led me to visit Viaghapatnam where I was thrilled impressed with the dear children who met me at the station. Pastors Nathaniel and Beulah. are caring for them as their own son Hudson and they are thriving from the love and tender care.

Prison

The Lord blessed the Word in the prison where some of the twenty men were weeping after the message and 10 repented of their sins. The guards were also affected by the Word and the Hindu governor found heart strangely warmed. Jagannihapuram Village.

I gave a message in the village where around 40 villages gathered. There are four adults who are saved from idol worship, one has a Bible.

Testimony

Pastor Jidigu told me that 5 months ago after a lifetime of waste in alcoholism he warned his father of his sinful life and re-told him the Gospel. He invited him to stay at the orphanage on condition he repented of his sins accepted Jesus Christ as his Saviour and Lord and stopped drinking and smoking. Amazingly he agreed and has been a changed man. He is free from addiction and has attended the meetings listening carefully to the Word even joining the children's meetings. The Lord has touched his life. All glory to God.

Invitations

I thank the Lord for His great blessing in India,. I have been invited to join Pastor Joseph in village outreach in Ranchi in Biha state. Pastor Joseph has baptised over 200 new converts this year. Pastor Jidigu asked me to conduct a three day Pastors conference in Bapatla. Both John and Pastor Joseph Babu, are planning another mission with larger meetings assembling 500 villagers also praying a large crusade in Rajahmundry with thousands attending.

I thank the dear Lord for your continuing faithful prayers and gifts. One sows, one waters, but God gives the increase.

Secunderbad

Joseph and Mary are handling finances and overseeing Sharon's ministry. Sharon has two more out preaching. The Prasad brothers are working with her in the village evangelism and supporting her in meetings in the slums. Sharon teaches basics to children who are not at school, also spiritual matters. Sharon helps young women to learn how to use a sewing machine.

She has been helping her mother nurse a younger sister Maria who has been operated on for breast cancer.

Works with slum families for physical and spiritual growth. 8 saved in villages 6 desire to be baptised. Gifts were sent for school uniforms.

Jacobs Farm

The buffalo farm has 7 animals now 3 more to come in 3 months' time. A learning curve. Pastor Joseph is in charge. Milk is now flowing and hopefully will come into profit for the home and pastors fund.

Colony Project.

The people are being given fruit, vitamins at Pastor Jidugu's discretion. Health improving. Regular gospel meetings on Sundays souls are being saved, folk baptised and some healing has taken place.

Sheila and Barbara's Home.

We now have an education fund and after paying for 5 students fees this current year we have a balance. Students are taking courses in IT, engineering and nursing. 7 extra children will be taken into the home in November with 2 more on waiting list.

Pastor's wife Sunitha has spasmodic eye trouble. Village preaching still continues with older boys joining experienced pastors. Pastors fellowship of 30 plus meets regularly for teaching and mutual support. The motorbike purchased for pastor is proving its worth.

Peduyim Home Visakhaptnam

The compound wall is completed and painted. 3 more children taken in and 4 more waiting. A buffalo has been purchased to supply milk for the Home. Pastor's fellowship now 10 pastors meeting monthly as at Bapatla. The children are learning IT skills on the new computer.

30 Bibles in Telugu and 10 in English have been purchased for the children. Pastor Nathaniel has been granted permission to preach in a main jail and four sub jails. Varan a woman was delivered from demon possession. One boy expressed a desire to serve the Lord. Pastor Nathaniel's son Hudson was healed of blood poisoning.

India

Both homes now set up with buffalo, computer a generator, motorbikes, sewing machines,

The Lord has wonderfully provided an anonymous gift for Sheila to visit India. We have applied for our visa and plan to visit in February next year. DV

Philippines

Future plans.

We are investigating the use of wind up radios for use in village ministry. Feba radio are being helpful and we may use them first in the Homes on a trial basis.

If for any reason you do not wish to receive news please advise us. We know you can continue to pray. No offence will be taken.

DBM. The team of trustees have recently been strengthened with two new trustees. John and Alice Plowman. We continue with our policy of "No appeals" but trusting the Lord to supply all needs. All admin expenses are met by the trustees and thus all gifts are used in entirety in ministry.

We also have a new accountant Josh Botham from The Deco Partnership which will release more money for ministry.

Daily Bread Missions – For Prayer Praise and Thanksgiving:

The Mission was soon labelled "Mission Impossible" both physically and spiritually. Covering 5 states and nearly 3000 miles internally, reaching over 1200 pastors in the tribal regions; including 12 pastors meetings, 8 village meetings and 10 Gospel meetings in Sheila's Home. Followed by a pastors meeting in a church in Yanam and a pastors meeting in Kakinada and family meetings in Hyderabad.

Only through the many hundreds of pastors in India and the many faithful Christians praying in UK did the Lord turn it to "Mission Accomplished."

I have been ministering in India since 1998 but the spiritual struggle on this trip was intense.

I was shocked as the deeper we went into the tribal regions the more horrible the paganism and idol worship and the more poverty.

The theme was Warning, Jeremiah 1 v 7-8. Ezekiel 3 v 17 -23 Ezekiel 33 v 3 -8 Testimony Psalm 118 v17 Jeremiah 30 v 17.

Teaching on a Life prayer/Obedience/Faith/ Sacrifice.

Then Challenge. Isaiah 6 v 8 –Ezekiel 22 v 30 -Acts 21 v 13.

Spirit Led Evangelism Act 8 v 29. Acts 16 v 6-7.

Booklets -

We distributed the "Discipleship Booklets" in 5 languages as we travelled. In Hyderabad Joseph and Mary presented me with the "Discipleship Booklet."

They explained it had taken three translators and one printers' editing to complete the translation in Malayalam for the state of Kerala, and they had paid for the printing themselves and sent 1000mn copies to Sheila's home for distribution. Pastor Elijah told me he has contacts in other states and will distribute the booklets to key pastors.

Pastors Meetings -

These pastors are key men in the battle for souls in India. In Piduguralla pastors walked 10-15 miles starting at 05:00 to arrive on time 10:00. In Pune the Word was anointed and the Spirit of the Lord moved in power. At the time for the challenge and appeal many pastors were deeply moved.

Blessings - Many Hindus listened outside the meeting at the windows and doors as the Word went forth.

Discipline - Pastors were invited for "Fasting Prayer" an hour before each meeting. Cell phones were banned and late comers had to wait before joining the meeting.

Sujan - Who translated for me in Guntur was anointed by the Holy Spirit with fire and stayed as my translator for 14 more meetings including Yanam and Kakinada. Many times "Glory to God," the Spirit moved among the men.

A woman who knows Sujan well, remarked on the change in his ministry, she said that she had never heard him preach like that. That is with assurance confidence and with some fire. PTL

Pune - I was shocked at extreme poverty in tribal regions. The pastors struggle with poverty. My translator was deeply moved, weeping, many other pastors touched by God.

Villages - In the Historical village a Muslim girl prayed a sinners prayer came forward for prayer. I prayed for blessings at the site of the building of the new church. In Delhi in a slum village, many young men after the message on faith, were weeping.

Sheila's Home - Ratna Kumari returned with husband Suresh and a baby; the children are required by law to attend school 7 days a week. The children meet every night for Gospel and Worship.

Opposition - Since President Modi threatened publically that there would be "No Christians or Muslims in India by 2020," this has given encouragement to Militant Hindus to attack Christians. I was guarded leaving meetings and car doors were always locked. Pastors attending meeting in Delhi were questioned; "Why have you come?" and "What village do you come from?"

On the train to Markapur

two aggressive Hindu men questioned pastor Raja about me. "Who is this man? Why has he come? Is he attending a conference?" We had to move seats and I was thankful to God when I got off the train safely.

Travel/ Prayer/ Food -

The Lord kept me safe on many rough roads and long train journeys some 12-18 hours. I was awake at 05:00 most mornings and most meetings were 4-5 Hours. I also spent many hours on the roof of my accommodation snatching some cool air early mornings and late afternoon while I prayed Pastor. Raja, Valli, Beulah and Mary all providing English food. I am sorry this report is so brief but only a small book would give a full account of the many amazing blessings; the Lord kept Sheila safe.



Daily Bread Missions- February- March 2006

There was every valid reason for not going to the Philippines the long journey confined to a small seat in an aircraft , my hip was painful, my blood pressure had soared due to anti inflammatory drugs, the mud slide, the political situation, the dangers, and at the time I booked my air fare there were no had been arrangements made, and no meetings had been booked. #

Over the years this work has always been supported by much prayer but I have never experienced so many people enquiring and praying in Canada, India, Poland, UK, and in the Philippines. However having decided to cancel the mission I was left sitting in pain. I realised that there would be no souls saved, none touched by God. I knew I had to go pain or no pain so I booked my ticket..

How the Lord opened the doors is both amazing and marvelous. Glory to God Pastor Tim Tapang in Negros Occidental with Pastor Ruben and Pastor Marlon from Cebu had arranged meetings in the prisons is San Carlos City Jail, Calaond City Jail, and Gihulngan City Jail. They brought with them boxes of Bibles for distribution to the new converts.



In the three prisons after the Word had been preached 267 prisoners had received Bibles and more wanted them.. I was also invited to be guest speaker at a school where 300 children and some adults were celebrating their anniversary

Ormoc Prison

On Leyte Island we visited Ormoc prison. 230 responded to the gospel call. The Lord had prepared their hearts. Pastor Lerion had managed to arrange for me to hire an air con van and after Ormoc we drove directly to Carigara to preach on the way to Tacloban City.

The prison here is situated beside the main road and the men left their huts to assemble in the compound. This meant that we had to speak to them through the high wired fence.

They listened intently and many were moved to tears. The Holy Spirit convicting them of their sins, many repenting and seeking the Lord. We distributed Gospels and tracts through the wire the men scrambled to obtain a copy and were not ashamed to read them immediately. Sadly we had to leave for our next meeting.

In Tacloban City jail around 200 or more prisoners sat as a secular group tuned up for a concert.. At that moment we arrived and Pastor Lerion told the Warden we wanted ¾ of an hour to an hour with no music. Amazingly the musicians packed up and switched off their equipment and were part of the 208 who responded to the Gospel message.



In Tacloban City I stayed in the local NFU university for P600 £6.00 a night while we visited Tacloban City Jail and Baseyon Samar Island where two more jails were visited. Once more the Lord poured out His Spirit and I witnessed many more hundreds of prisoners repenting, believing and receiving Christ as their own personal Lord and Saviour. The Lord having graciously supplied money for Bibles we were able to distribute to the men who manifested a desire for the Word

Cebu Island

The arrangements for Bicol Island fell through, I was not disappointed as the Lord had warned me before that this was a possibility and I had made provisional arrangements. The Lord led me to return to Cebu Island where Pastor Ruben and Pastor Marlon had more prison meetings scheduled. More amazing scenes with men in terrible and awful conditions listened intently to the Word and responded 100%

The power of praise in the worship times and the evidence and witness of the Holy Spirit confirmed that the Lord had prepared the ground for the precious incorruptible seed.. We visited Cebu City jail, Danau City Jail, Lapu having visited the women's section there, the junior section and the main prisons where up to 200 or 300 men were confined.

I have been used to the squalor in the jails but was continually shocked at the filth, darkness, heat, overcrowding and insanitary conditions. Sadly there is not much hope for these men outside the prison with no prospect of employment and a deep, deep poverty prevailing all around.

In all more than 1500 indicated they wanted to follow Jesus, men who have prayed a "Sinner's Prayer", some broken and deeply moved by the message who indicated a real repentance and a desire to be saved. The Lord is building His church in a wonderful way in the prisons.

There were many difficulties, English food was scare, the heat, the bad roads, the accommodation (apart for my stay in Villa Ormoc Hotel in Ormoc City) I was bitten by mosquitoes, bitten by ants, my Case fell out of the luggage rack in the coach breaking my Computer keyboard.

My nights were disturbed so I was constantly tired, some days I preach four times added to the long journeys over rough broken roads, but the Lord strengthened me.. At times I forgot all about my hip. It was anesthetized by God until I returned to London to foolishly run up the stairs at Victoria Station rushing for a train.

I had a meeting in Pastor Lerion's Home with 30 Children. Bob Lerion had organized a viewing of the Jesus film in the LNU University where 60/70 young students viewed the film I was asked to speak to them before the film began. So with the Lord helping I preached the Gospel.

For Praise Prayer and Thanksgiving. Acts 8.v 29/30 God's provision.

I thank the Lord for so many who gave so generously. Thus the Lord enabled me to distribute many sacks of rice to very poor and needy lepers, orphan children. One pastor said he could hardly bear to see the children with pain on their faces and not having any food for them that day.

Safety and security. The Lord wonderfully protected me from the chaos and horrendous traffic situations, a very real danger of physical attack and arduous journeys at night Please pray for the Christians.

One pastor was brutally attacked and beaten in Nylore his wife is traumatised. Fanatical Hindus wielding machetes deliberately set upon another preacher. He and his family were badly wounded. The situation is serious for many pastors in the outlying villages where I was told there are still humane sacrifices once a year. One night in a tribal area we cancelled a meeting in a village because late at night it was too dangerous. Travelling back from the tribal region, several times a group of men blocking the road to stop your vehicle our drivers kept going only missing hitting them.

Health, I had various problems through unsanitary conditions, dirty water, and dangerous food, despite rigorous precautions.

I was stuffed full of anti malaria tablets, badly bitten by mosquitoes, attacked with throat and chest infection and diarrhoea following drinking water from a bottle labelled pure sparkling purified mineral water that had been refilled from the well..

Hyderabad slums area.

We set off in an auto rickshaw through clouds of sulphurous smoke and the chaotic traffic that is India. I was shocked at the slum conditions although having seen them many times. Sister Davee asked me to pray for her sister who is due to have a tumour removed from her breast. The poor woman was fearful, with some good reason. A small room crammed with around 40 folks, plus many children and more folks crowding around the door and in the street, curious about the white man that had come.

The Lord enabled me to preach the Gospel and blessed with 30 or more responding to the message. After the meeting we walked through the dirt and slum district to the refuse tip. Families lived in groups of 20/30, in makeshift hovels, actually in the middle of the tip. It is hard to describe the filth, sewage, stagnant water in ditches, mixed with the rubbish, no water, no electricity, cooking on open fires with small sacks of rice stored in branches of the one tree, out of reach of the rats.

The congregation a few Christians, but mostly Hindu seemingly unaware of the flies or danger of disease. Again another wonderful meeting of praise and an amazing response to the Word of God. The following day we congregated in another derelict home of a Christian with around 30/40 folk gathered to praise the Lord. Praise God many more responding positively to the appeal. Later after some rest we boarded the night train at 7 PM due to arrive in

Rajahmundry at 5 AM.

Rajahmundry I was taken to Pastor Joseph's home and met Sunitha his wife. for her as she is three months pregnant but has a problem with low blood count.

The orphanage has 30 children, and with her baby this will make 31 children in the home plus 17 old folks all living eating and sleeping in one room. I found my hands badly bitten by mosquito in the night and my head spinning with tiredness.

Rock breakers. After a short rest we boarded the bus for a meeting with the rock breakers at 11 AM . I was amazed when we drove into the middle of their work place and they left their work to gather around me. Maybe 70 or more folk. They listened intently to the Word and many, maybe 60 or more responded to the message. Praise God. I shook hands with them all and prayed for their children, who also come to help with the labour.

Free medicines. Later after rest I prayed with the children before leaving for the evening meeting in a slum area. The folk were attentive and around twenty responded to the appeal. I then prayed as the doctor gave out free medicine to the thronging people

Visaghapatnam. . . . After a nights sleep I boarded the train at 9 AM and arrived in Visahaspatnam at 12 45 to be met by Pastor Natnhaniel, the church elders who took me to a hotel. Later at 6PM we drove along the coast road to Tagarapuualsa town and I gave out the Word in a Baptist church. Several pastors from other churches came. I prayed for many folk including a woman with cancer, a man with skin disease and young teenager with sever sight problem. The next day we travelled on the main Calcutta highway avoiding three head on crashes to a village.

The meeting commenced with me being bedecked with a garland of flowers and huge quantities of petals thrown over me. Around 15 adults and twenty five children gathered to hear the Word. Twenty folk responded to the Word. Then nearly all came for prayer, I had to tell some of them (before I could pray for them) to remove and destroy their occult fetishes, obtained from the witch doctors. The Lord blessed and I was led to give money for a sack of rice for the villagers. I returned down coast road to Visaghapatnam and again in the evening back to the Baptist Church in $\tau_{agarapuua1sa}$ for another meeting when around 30 came forward for prayer. Returned to Hotel at 11.15 PM.

Rahajmundruy tribal region The next day I returned to Rajahmundry by train and in the early evening went out 60 klm to the tribal region. We travelled in the medical van, along the river bank where Pastor John has baptised hundreds of converts over the years. We bumped down endless rough tracks stopping at various places along the way to meet and pray with Pastors and families. One pastor I was told received only ten and twenty rupees in the offerings I was led to give R500 to his wife..

We stopped at the first village where I preached and prayed for around 30 folks. Some hearing the Gospel and responding for the first time. Doctor Prakesh gave out medicines. Moving on to another village where I preached at 9 PM, again more prayers, more converts and more free medicines and then onto another village where I preached at 11PM. I think they woke up the village and called them to the meeting in a small church.

At the conclusion of my message a woman was moaning and crying hysterically. It seemed very weird. I wondered if it was a demon? The doctor gave his examinations and interviewed the long queue of folk seeking help. The Lord blessed. I cannot quantify what the Lord has done...

We returned to the van very tired but could not rest on the return journey as the van was lurching over very rough tracks. Several times we were waved down by groups of men in the middle of the road but our experienced driver swerved and did not stop. As we entered the city in the early hours the van engine faltered was restarted and faltered again having run out of diesel.

Amazingly we cruised down the main road turned into side roads and came to a stop outside the orphanage. How we praised God. I stepped over some of the forty sleeping bodies in the orphanage and started to get ready for bed when the cook brought in a plate with three omelettes and chips with hot tea. I tumbled into bed at 2 AM grateful to God for an amazing day. How many souls had been saved maybe 60? Cannot tell but I do know it was amazing and wonderful

Nethervole Church. We travelled along the riverbank and crossed over near Sir Arthur Cottons dam and canal. I preached "How shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation". Pastor John Babu told me later a young man who had been absent from the church for a year had been present in the meting and the Word had touched him. I prayed again for around 30 folk.

Leper Colony In the afternoon we proceeded to the leper colony situated in a rubbish tip the land being donated free by the Indian government. Nearby a Hindu temple. The lepers mostly without fingers or toes, around 40 of them sat crossed legged and praised the Lord. I was appalled at the scene. Pastor John Babu was trying to swot the hundreds of flies from my feet and from my water bottle. The worship time was impressive and powerful. I gave my message and prayed and left a gift for a sack of rice...It was very moving and unforgettable experience...Pray for them..

Pastors conference. Around 150 pastors gathered on the roof of the orphanage to hear the Word. We had two main meetings AM and PM .Pastor Joseph was thrilled as 100 of the pastors were from "Word in Action Outreach", but another 50 were from other denominations in the City The word went forth with power and liberty. Many were touched by God...Invitations to return were plentiful.

Tribal region. Tuesday 14th Jan . We set off at 9 am in the medical van with the Dr Prakesh and Pastor John and Joseph Babu. It was a long gruelling journey of 100 klm over rough jungle tracks. We stopped at the river town to negotiate the hire of a boat. R600 . We chugged along as the boatman bailed out the water leaking in the front while I was reminded that there are crocodiles, bears and tigers in this region. One tiger had got so hungry he would swim out to passing boats and try to board them, once was successful and attacked the passengers. It was eventually shot.

Kachubusa. It was beautiful journey after an hour and ten minutes we arrived at the first village, climbing up the bank 60 ft to follow the trail. I was told in August all this land was all under water. I was shown a cement hut built high on the hillside and this was the refuge built by the government, even this had been under water in the flood of 1987. As I entered the village was met with curious glances as the first white man in that village. The people quickly assembled and I gave my Gospel message to around 30 folk. I thank the Lord for the wonderful response from these Hindu idol worshippers.. God is doing a great work among them in these last days..

After more prayers and free medicines had been distributed we had lunch well they ate there rice and I munched on dry biscuits and toast. We left at 4PM and took the boat back to another village

Crondura. I gave the word in a village's squalid hut and was told later that five souls were saved. Two naked boys were covered in green I was told they had chicken pox. Pathetic scenes as the doctor gave medicines. I walked out to overlook the river and pray. We returned tired to the boat to go to the next village but this was cancelled as the Pastor said it was too dangerous. I was told Hindus in this area still have a human sacrifice once a year and when night comes hit the bottle and have cock fighting gambling and drunken orgies... So we returned down the river in the moon light stopping only at the police boat to report our safe return. Apparently the pastor had informed the local police of out medical trip..

Orphans Home. 15th Jan.

I was greeted on my birthday with the orphan children sing a happy birthday. I opened my birthday card from my case. I had been to town on the back of Joseph's motorcycle to send emails at the internet café and buy t shirt for Joseph stock up with biscuits and grapes and some oranges. Joseph bought me a Indian suit and I wore it for the chilkdrens meeting. The Lord helped me to give the word 2 Chron 9 v 1-7 ..."Happy are these thy servants" and Mephibosheth invited to the Kings table....The Lord blessed the Word and Sunitha Pastor Joseph's wife wept...

Babaptla. John Sunitha Jospeh and Sambo accompanied me to the station. The train was late by 50 minutes and I said my goodbyes. I arrived in the early hours 12 20 AM on an deserted platform to be met by Pastor Rajaptnam and the elders of his church. They garlanded me with flowers and had carried a banner of welcome...A car took us to Bhvanana Residency a seedy run down hotel while Pastor Jidigu shared some of his testimony. I gratefully slept until 7 AM. Woke up with the Hindu temple blasting out amplified music and wailing. Looked out the window to view more appalling poverty. I visited the orphanage where 17 children live in one room.

The orphanage is 5 months behind in its rent and the pastor and his wife Sunitha struggle to feed them one meal a day. There is no where for the children to play and the building is backed by a ditch filled with refuse and stagnant water. I sang to the children and told bible stories. In the brief time since coming home three children have been sponsored

.

Ercola Village. In the afternoon we visited by car a village where Pastor Jidigu labours to win souls. He told me that most are still involved in idol worship but gradually they are hearing the gospel and responding. They showered me with flower petals before I spoke and afterwards all requested prayer.

I had to tell some of them to remove their fetishes, which they have bought to bring good luck from the witch doctor. In the evening we go to the outskirts of the town to a small church. The noise was almost unbearable and then the lord helped me to declare his Word. After a nights rests we set off to take the children to the beach. They were so thrilled. I walked up and down for an hour in prayer.

Chondole village. This was an open air village meeting where the folk sat on mats many listened with rapt attention to the Word Many responded in a sinner's prayer. Many came seeking healing I prayed for another 30 folk in great need.

Babpatla. The harbour and Church. We hired an old car for R600 the steering was suspect brakes bad, and set of 60 klm to the harbour district stopping on the way at the police inspectors house to ask for protection. On arrival safely we toured the fishing area and went to the fishermen's village. The smell of bad fish permeated everything. The conditions were primitive and squalid. Around 80 or more folk gathered around listening to the Word

Another amazing meeting with a wonderful anointing on "Toiled all night and caught nothing," where 80 responded in praying a sinners prayer... Some women were sobbing. Leaving the fishermen we drove into the town in total darkness there was a power cut and went to the local village church. The Lord enabled me to proclaim his word, seven fires of God then prayed with 30 or 40 folk.. After supper, I had cold potatoes and cabbage, returned thankfully and very tired , safely to Bapatla City.

Sunday Bapatla,

Meeting in Orphans Home.

I take my last meeting in Bapatla speaking to the children and say goodbye The car arrives and is another dangerous car. The steering very bad and the driver has to pump the brakes to make them work. A long journey but arrive safely in Vijahawadda to sit for two hours on the platform waiting for the train. train to Bangalore.

The train arrived at 4 40 and we set off for a 14 hour journey arriving in the morning. I am offered a bottom bunk and retire at 8 PM to lurch through the night. The train arrives at Bangalore at 10 AM.

There is no one to meet me. I telephone and wait a half an hour before a 4 wheeler comes to rescue me., While waiting I am threatened by a man who apparently is mad. I call a nearby policeman who is not really interested. The traffic is horrendous and the exhaust fumes fill the air with blue smog.

The cars are almost gridlocked but we fight our way through chased at one point by an angry traffic policeman. I arrive at Headquarters to meet Francis and then set off again to other side of town to my lodgings in a guest house. I meet Mary Adams a writer who is compiling a book on the life of Francis Jackson. We go to the city shops and I buy some Cornflakes'...

Bangalore

Ist Church Tuesday

I the Lord search the heart... Around 80 folks singing with load amplification and drums Preached at 8 10 PM The power failed half way through sand we were plunged into darkness after a while I continued with the help of candles then my translator arrived and we swapped over. The young man who had started translating had been his first time... One or two women came to thank me for the word. Two bible students came to request prayer and also the Pastor and his family.

2nd Church Wednesday

Arrived at 7 15 PM in a small church The Lord helped me give the message. "Our God is a consuming fire" Many were touched by God.

3rd Church Thursday

Pastor Jackson invited me to speak in his church. It was prayer meeting night. When I arrived another power cut and entered the prayer hall to find it lit by candles. Much fervent prayer and great attention to the Word.. I shared testimony and some lessons. Many were touched.. After the word many came for prayer. One woman with some mental complaint fell to the floor as I prayed for her. An American man named all prayed and prophesied over me..

Trial of return journey. All was set for my return to England I had booked a flight from Banaglore to Madras at 8PM I had to arrive at the airport at 7 PM. I asked pastor Jackson to send transport. I spoke to the drivers during the day requesting that they arrive on time..

They were due at 6PM but did not arrive.. I waited until 6 15 PM before taking my case and walking down the road to the local computer shop where I knew there was a telephone. I had visited the internet café over the last four days and found them helpful and friendly. Earlier I had asked them to give me some telephone numbers of local taxi firms, which they had done. Now I asked could they please telephone for a taxi to the airport...

Sadly when they got through the taxi could not come for another half an hour. Too late. They tried two or three others with the same result.. I walked away back to the guest house trailing my case and bag. I had hardly got one hundred yards before a motor bike pulled up beside me.

The computer man asked could he help me give me a lift to the main road where possibly I might get an autorickshaw? I looked at the motorbike and looked at my case. Was it possible. Well it was only for a few local streets. I accepted his offer and climbed onto the back of the motorbike and held the heavy bag in one hand and trailed the suitcase behind in the other..

Going slowly the suitcase ran on its little wheels and we made slow progress. What I had not planned for or expected was when we reached the main road the motor bike continued speeding up. I was shocked and amazed but unable to alter anything The case raced along well but it must have been an unusual sight., After a mile or so on the main road we spotted an autorickshaw and after negotiating a price R60 transferred my luggage.

We set off the autorickshaw was ancient and kept stalling in the thick traffic however I praised God we were making progress and soon arrived at the airport departure lounge. It was exactly 7 PM. I had made it. Praise the Lord

50.000 Tracts

I emailed John Harder of Evangelical Tract Distributers and requested 50.000 tracts for distribution in the delta region at Rajahmundry. Every 12 years around 12 million Hindus arrive to bathe in the river to wash away their sins. More than 150 pastors and their churches are planning to evangelise in December this year

"This is your flight" I was amazed. I had been sitting in the departure lounge expecting to board at 8.50 PM Within three minutes I was on the plane and shortly after we were airborne.. It was 8.05 PM I had assumed that the 8.50 was my flight. I could have missed it easily. What had made that woman ask me? Only the Lord knows!!!

The Philippines.

Please pray as already I am involved in preparing for Mission Philippines. My dates are 22nd February until12/13th March. I fly to Kuala Lumpa and then to Cebu City on Cebu Island to join John Valdaviso for a week in the prisons and local churches. Then ferry to Ormoc and a prison visit before travelling to Tacloban City. It will be a joy to see the Lerion's home on the higher ground. I guess there will be visits to Tacloban City jail, The hospital and local churches... DV I plan to return via Manila and Heathrow via Frankfurt.

Secunderbad

Sharon has two more brothers out preaching in the village evangelism and supporting her in meetings in the slums. Sharon teaches basics lessons to children who are not at school, gifts were sent for school uniforms.

Sharon helps young women to learn how to use a sewing machine and works with slum families for physical and spiritual growth. She reported that 8 souls were saved in villages and 6 desire to be baptised.

Jacobs Farm

The buffalo farm has 7 animals now 3 more to come in 3 months time. A learning curve. Pastor Joseph is in charge. Milk is now flowing and hopefully will come into profit for Sheila's Home and the PPF fund. Colony Project.

The people are being given fruit, vitamins at Pastor discretion. Their health is improving. Regular gospel meetings on Sundays, souls are being saved, folk baptised and some healing has taken place.

Sheila and Barbara's Home.

We now have an education fund and after paying for 5 students fees this current year. Students are taking courses in IT, engineering and nursing. 7 extra children will be taken into the home in November making the total 35 with 2 more on waiting list. Village preaching still continues with older boys joining experienced pastors.

Pastors fellowship of 30 plus meets regularly for teaching and mutual support. The motorbike purchased for pastor is proving its worth.

Peduyim Home

The compound wall is completed and painted. 3 more children taken in making the total 26 children with 4 more waiting. A buffalo has been purchased to supply milk for the Home. Pastor's fellowship now 10 pastors meeting monthly as at Baptala. The children are learning IT skills on the new computer. 30 Bibles in Telugu and 10 in English have been purchased for the children. Pastor Nathaniel has been granted permission to preach in a main jail and four sub jails

Philippines

Many souls saved there are short video clips of my recent blessed trip to the Philippines on the web page click on multimedia and then video. The prison ministry is in capable hands and is on a sound footing with excellent follow up; DVD is available on request of Prison ministry.

Future plans.

We are investigating the use of wind up radios for use in village ministry in India Feba Radio are being helpful and we may use them first in the Homes on a trial basis.

DBM.

The team of trustees have recently been strengthened with two new trustees John and Alice Plowman.

Faith.

We continue with our policy of "No appeals" for money or funds but trusting the Lord to supply all needs.

All administration costs are met by the trustees and thus all gifts given to DBM are used in entirety in ministry. Tony's mission trips continue to be provided by personal gifts as we continue to live by faith.
