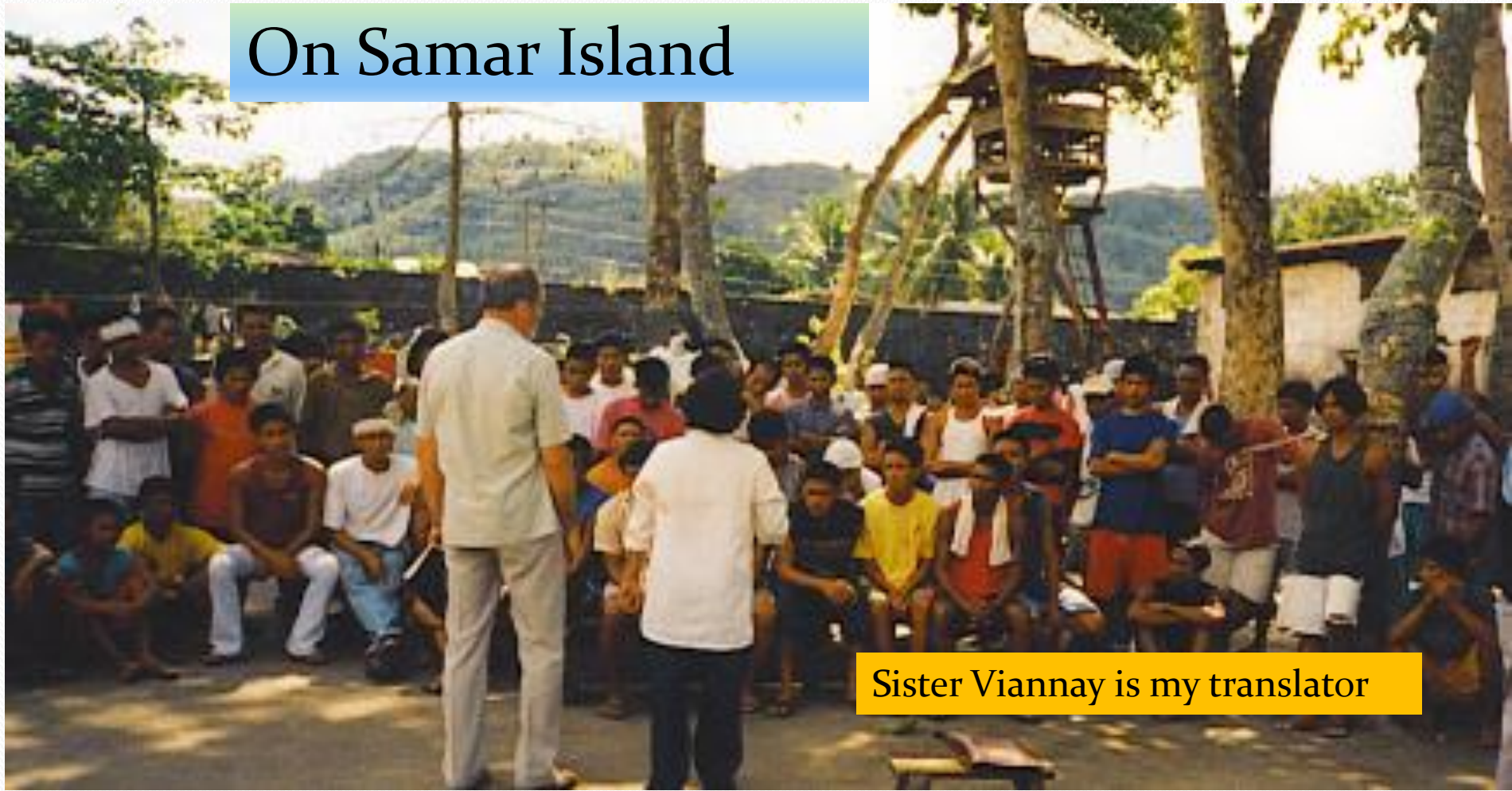

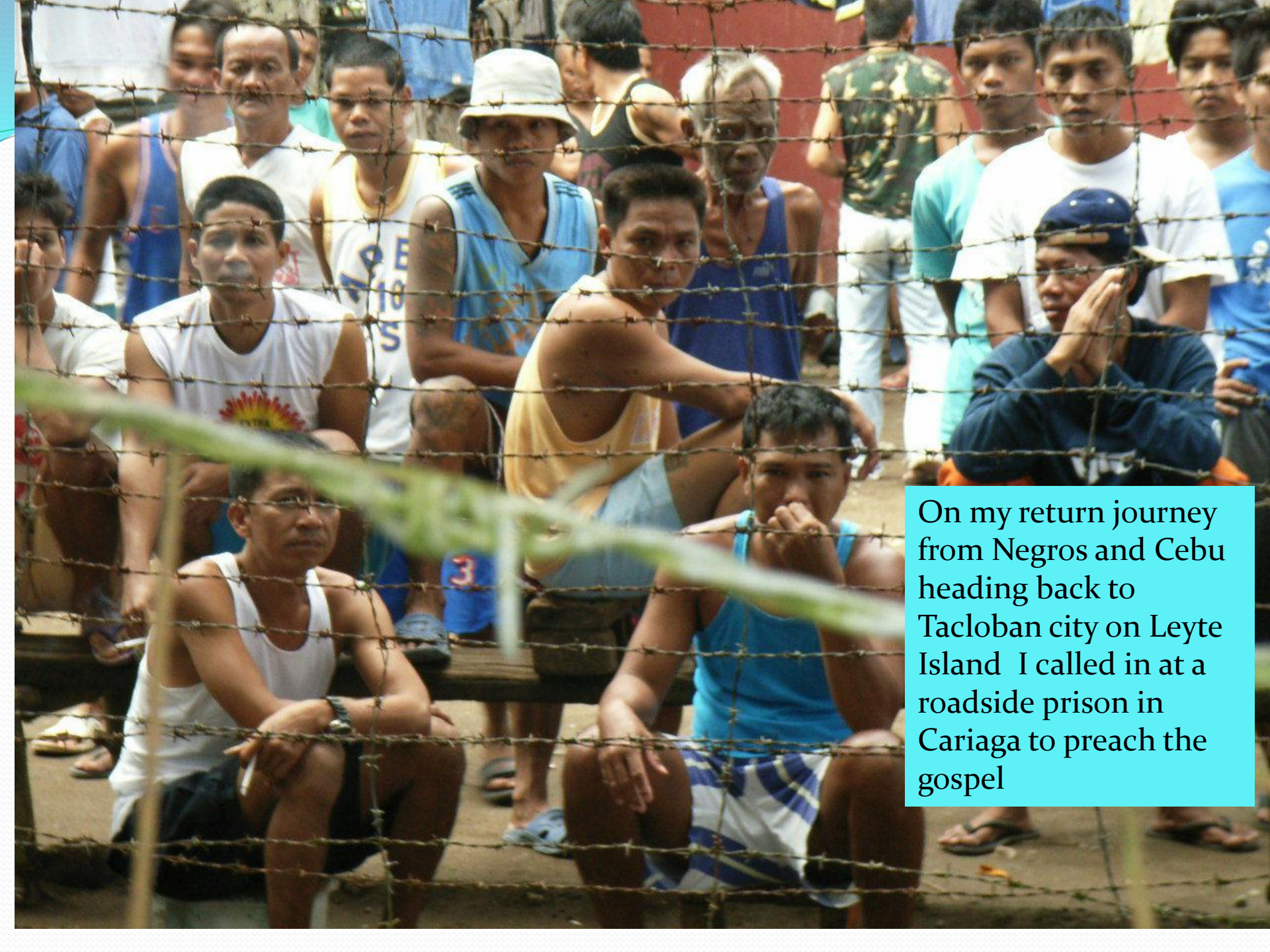

On my return journey from Negros and Cebu heading back to Tacloban city on Leyte Island I called in at a roadside prison in Cariaga to preach the gospel

Hundreds hear the Gospel



We crossed many derelict bridges on a motorbike but some were too dangerous so we walked. A dangerous drop to the river below.



On this first trip to Libertad Village we were tracked by armed men who surrounded the village and questioned the village elders. Who is this man. Why has he come?

Two years before the villagers had been attacked by armed men and some villagers were killed. The Lord protected me and kept us safe.

Amazing Blessing 204 Prisoners





The Lord opened the door to this prison and the Spirit of the Lord fell to touch many hearts.

Pastor Tim Tapang from San Carlos accompanied me and translated my messages as we preached in all the prisons, in Negros Occidental, Iloilo and Guimaras Islands



Everywhere and always the men listened intently and responded praying a sinners prayer





The prison population at the time we arrived was over 500 . On our left was a Christian choir made up of converted prisoners.



We would visit 3 / 4 or sometime 5 prisons a day large and small everywhere the Word was listened to with great attention, many prisoners wept, and there was joy in heaven.



Arriving in the tribal regions in Libertad Village I found the conditions very basic, washing outside my hut.



The Philippines being an archipelago travel between the islands was always by ferry or Bamboat. Some very old boats still being used well after sell by date.

- The country only had it's own government by 1934!



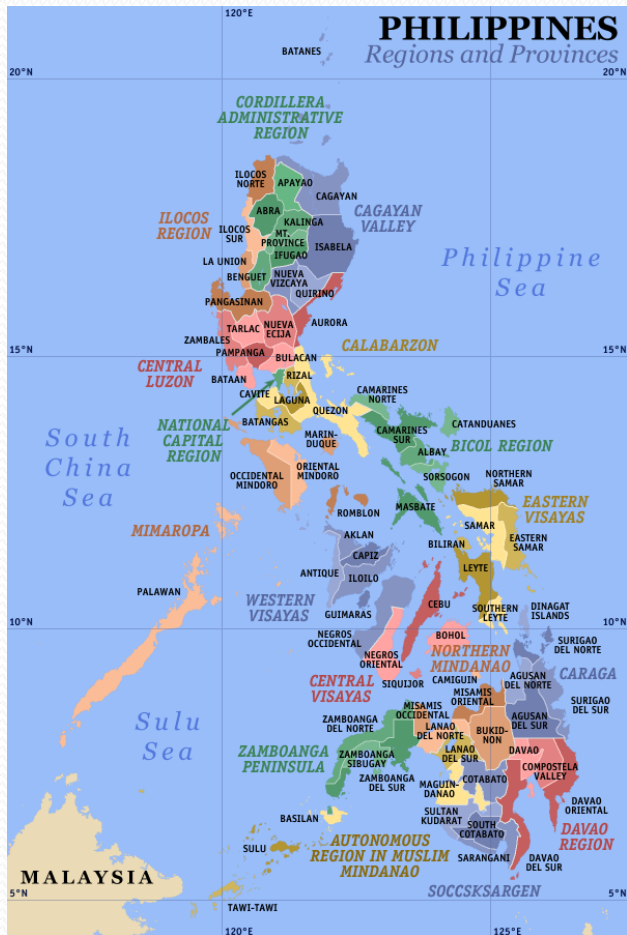
